Workload per Semester & Courses Selection	<p>All UG students usually take 3 to 5 courses per semester based on 3 AU per course (subject to home university's and NIE-NTU's approval). Application Procedure For Study	<p>Nominated students coming to NIE on Study Programme must adhere to the following application criteria and procedures:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Partner universities must nominate the student to NIE via our nomination portal: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nominated students coming to NIE on exchange must be a full-time, matriculated student in one of NIE's exchange partner institutions; and have completed at least two semesters of study at their home university prior to the exchange semester, with proof of results. Nominated students must have an average B grade or equivalent. Upon successful nomination, students can apply to NIE via the Online Application Portal. Students will receive a link to the Online Application Portal via email.

Mandatory documents to Be submitted with your online application

*Submission of hardcopy applications is **not** required*

1. **Latest official transcript in English** (signed by the Registrar and stamped with the home university's seal), reflecting all courses taken. Students also need to include a **list of current courses** (if they are not shown in the transcript). The official transcript and list of current courses should be submitted in one file, in PDF format (<2MB).
2. **Clear, coloured passport-size photo in JPG format for your matriculation card.** Kindly adhere to the photo guidelines as incomplete applications may be delayed or rejected. (JPG format, <100kb)
3. **Clear, coloured, scanned copy of your full passport information page.** The image provided must display all details on the bio-page of the passport. This information must be available so as to prepare your Student's Pass application. Please ensure that your passport is valid for at least 6 months from the commencement of your exchange at NIE. (JPG format, <200kb)
4. **Up-to-date Curriculum Vitae (CV) in Word format (<600kb)**

Application Deadlines and Procedures

DOCUMENTS TO PREPARE

English Proficiency

Proof of English language proficiency is not required for students who are native speakers of English, or where English is the core language of instruction in the home institution.

Below are the guidelines for the level of English proficiency best suited to studying at NIE:

- General Paper of the Singapore Cambridge GCE 'A' Level Examination (sat in 2007 onwards): A, B, C, D, E
- General Paper of the Singapore Cambridge GCE 'A' Level Examination (sat in 2006 or earlier): A1, A2, B3, B4, C5, C6
- IELTS: a minimum of 6 for the Writing sub-test
- TOEFL: a minimum of 570 (paper) or 90 (internet) or 237 (computer)
- SAT1: a minimum of 600 for the Verbal section; or 7 for the Essay section
- IB: a minimum of 4 for Higher Level English or 4 for Standard Level English
- MUET: Band 6 and a minimum of 50 for writing
- GEPT: High intermediate Stage 2 consisting of writing and speaking modules (applies to students from Taiwan universities only)

The guidelines are in place to ensure exchange students are suited to cope with the rigorous curriculum conducted in English.

You may request for a letter from your home university, confirming your English proficiency and ability to follow classes in English, if you do not have any of the abovementioned test scores.

Courses Selection	<p>During application, exchange students are required to select <u>at least ten courses per semester</u> (in order of preference) for approval. Course approval is subjected to vacancies and pre- requisites.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This is to ensure that you have an adequate number of approved courses prior to arrival in NIE. • Please ensure that the courses you select are suitable for credit transfer back at your home university. • Selected courses are subject to approval by the offering Schools in NIE. However, approval does not mean a guaranteed enrolment in the courses, as courses are subjected to vacancies and class/exam timetable. • Once approved, you are strongly encouraged not to deviate from the list of approved courses. It is imperative that you select courses which are approved by your home university and are deemed necessary for your academic progression. • Requests to reselect courses while you are in NIE will only be processed if there are valid reasons. <p>Course Issues:</p> <p>In the event you do not have sufficient approved courses prior to your arrival at NIE, you may still add on or modify your course plan during the 2-week add/drop period after your arrival at NIE Please note that <u>course approval is subjected to NIE pre-requisites and vacancies</u>. Hence, you must be prepared to read other courses if you do not meet the pre-requisites.</p>

Course Registration	<p>Exchange students will be pre-allocated a number of their approved UG courses during NIE course registration. You may still register for additional approved UG courses during the Add/Drop period in the first two weeks of the semester.</p> <p>Please note that while NIE will try to meet the demand where possible, exchange students should expect that not all demands can be met, and students are encouraged to be flexible with their study plan.</p>
Academic Transcripts	<p>Upon completion of the Study exchange, two copies of the official NIE transcript will be mailed to the student's home university within two months of the release of examination results. One of the copies will be for the student's retention while another will be retained by the home university. Electronic transcripts are not available.</p>

Housing

<p>On-campus housing for exchange students</p>	<p>Incoming Study exchange students may apply for on-campus housing on availability basis.</p> <p>Incoming Research exchange students shall be recommended for off-campus housing in view of the varied project dates.</p> <p>Upon acceptance as an exchange student, you may apply online for on campus housing through the application form provided in the Welcome email before the stipulated closing date.</p> <p>Students who have submitted an online application for campus housing before the stipulated closing date will be considered for on-campus housing, on availability basis. Students who are unsuccessful in their campus housing application would need to look for off-campus options.</p> <p>Students who are successful in their campus housing application will be allocated randomly for hall rooms, and requests for specific types of rooms will be evaluated on a case by case basis. Students with medical condition(s) and/or have specific requests will have to submit a doctor's letter certifying their condition, which shall subsequently be verified by NTU's Medical Centre.</p> <p>Students are required to declare medical conditions and requests when submitting their application to the ISP unit.</p> <p>Request for specific roommates or preferred Halls is not allowed.</p> <p>Full-year exchange students, who successfully secured on-campus housing for their first semester must re-apply for housing in their second semester.</p> <p>Period of stay in the Hall is determined by the approved period of exchange as stipulated on the NIE Offer Letter.</p> <p>Please see housing options for more information.</p>
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Housing

<p>Check-in date for Halls of Residence</p>	<p>The earliest that exchange students may move into their allocated room in the Hall of Residence is usually three days before the commencement of the semester.</p> <p>The Office of Campus Housing (OCH) shall notify the exchange students on the exact check-in date and timings via EMAIL from ISP Unit. Check-in will only be available during weekdays and office hours of the hall admin offices.</p> <p>Exchange students who intend to arrive earlier than the check-in date and/or arrive outside of office hours will have to source for temporary off-campus housing. A list of temporary off-campus housing can be found at this link.</p>
<p>Off-Campus Housing</p>	<p>Students seeking off-campus housing should begin their search well in advance of their arrival in Singapore. Students are recommended to search in Estates near NIE NTU such as: Boon Lay, Jurong West and Jurong East.</p> <p>For more information please refer to this link.</p>

Immigration and Entry Requirements

Student's Pass	<p>All international students who have been accepted and offered a place as a full-time matriculated or registered student are required to hold a valid Student's Pass issued by the Singapore Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA).</p> <p>You will be notified of the Student's Pass application procedures via email. Students are advised to arrange their flights only after their Student's Pass and Entry Approval applications have been approved.</p> <p>Non-graduating or exchange students holding Student's Pass are not allowed to work during the immersion period.</p> <p>For more information, please refer to this link.</p>
Entry Visa Requirements	<p>Students who require an entry visa to enter Singapore <u>need not</u> apply for one. Upon approval of the Student's Pass application, an In-Principle Approval (IPA) letter will be issued to the students. A single journey visa shall be incorporated in the IPA letter for entry into Singapore.</p> <p>For more immigration matters, you may refer to this link.</p>

Travel Health Control Measures for Entry

COVID-19 Vaccination

All Student's Pass holders (STP) will need to be vaccinated against COVID-19* and achieve minimum protection before you can complete formalities for the pass issuance, unless you are medically exempted and certified by a Singapore doctor. Please refer to Ministry of Health ([MOH](#)) website for more details on how to achieve minimum protection. Applicants who were vaccinated overseas must visit a Singapore healthcare provider to update their overseas vaccination records into Singapore's National Immunisation Registry (NIR).

Applicants whose vaccination records are not found in the NIR will not be allowed to complete formalities. Please refer to the FAQs on the Ministry of Health (MOH)'s website for more information on recognising overseas vaccinations as well as the list of healthcare providers providing such services.

Applicants who cannot be vaccinated due to medical conditions will need to produce a Singapore doctor's memo stating the following details, when completing formalities at the counter:

- Medical condition
- Reason(s) for being unable to take any COVID-19 vaccination, regards of the brand of vaccine used.

Health and Wellness	<p>Medical, dental and counselling services are available on campus to cater to your health and wellness needs.</p> <p>Should you feel unwell after office hours, you may proceed to nearby Clinics for assistance. For acute medical care and emergencies, please visit the nearest hospital, Ng Teng Fong General Hospital.</p> <p>For more information on Health and Wellness, you may refer to NIE Wellness Centre. Medical Declaration	<p>To ensure that your well-being is addressed, students who have existing conditions (medical, physical/mobility, sensory impairment, neurological deficits and/or learning disabilities) are required to submit medical documentation and/or specialist assessment reports during online application stage for verification.</p> <p>Students will be requested to provide the following documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Letter or memo from doctor certifying the student is fit for overseas immersion programme. The letter must be in English, and should be issued by the attending psychiatrist or medical practitioner specialising on the declared condition; • Doctor's memo indicating medication and dosages. The memo needs to be in English, and indicates current prescription including alternative medication; • Assessment report (if required); • Accommodation letter (in English) from home university, describing type of support provided at home university. <p>Upon arrival at NIE, students are required to undergo further medical assessments/counselling to ascertain appropriate support services if so needed, for the well-being of students. These assessments may be conducted internally at NTU or externally by third-party service providers. In such cases, students may need to bear the costs for such assessments.</p> <p>For students on long-term medication, please refer to Health Sciences Authority's website for more information on bringing personal medication into Singapore.</p>

Well-Being and Insurance

Declaration of Disability	<p>Exchange students who have a disability and require academic support services must submit documentary proof of their disability (doctor's letter and assessment report in English) and an accommodation letter in English from their home university, indicating the type of support services they are currently receiving. Please note that NIE support services may be different from what is offered in the home university. Students should also bring along the original assessment report during the exchange semester.</p> <p>The information is important for review and advice on availability of similar support services at NIE.</p>
Health Screening	<p>Exchange students who are studying at NIE/NTU for more than 6 months will need to undergo a health screening at the NTU's Medical Centre - Fullerton Health @ NTU. The health screening results may be used to fulfil the Immigration & Checkpoints Authority's (ICA) requirements for Student's Pass Holders, unless otherwise advised.</p> <p>Details of the health screening and appointment time slots will be advised during student's arrival. Please note that the health screening will incur an estimated cost of \$50 to \$100.</p>

Well-Being and Insurance

NIE NTU Student Insurance Schemes

It is compulsory for all exchange students to be covered under the NIE/NTU student insurance schemes, namely Group Personal Accident Insurance (GPAI), Group Hospitalisation & Surgical Insurance (GHSI) and Medical scheme, even if students have already bought similar insurance in their home country. **The cost of these student insurance schemes is included in the compulsory NIE NTU Miscellaneous fees.**

Falling ill and being hospitalised in Singapore can be a financial drain on international students, who are not entitled to the medical subsidies that Singapore citizens enjoy. Besides the coverage it provides, the GHSI (subject to its terms and conditions) allows you to request a Letter of Guarantee from the underwriter and present it in lieu of the requisite deposit upon admission to government/ restructured hospitals in Singapore.

Well-Being and Insurance

Personal Insurance

Exchange students would be covered by the NIE/NTU Student Insurance Schemes mentioned above. It is recommended for you to familiarise yourself with the insurance coverage provided by these Student Insurance Schemes. [Link](#)

With the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, it is recommended that you ensure you have sufficient and comprehensive coverage for COVID-19 treatment and travel during your trip (to and from Singapore), as well as during the semester. You may wish to purchase additional personal or travel insurance for further coverage.

Depending on prevailing border measures at the point of arrival, you may also be required to provide proof of travel insurance or medical insurance coverage for entry to Singapore.

Costs

Living Cost	The living costs you incur will depend on your lifestyle. On average, students should prepare an estimated SGD 7,000 per semester to defray costs such as accommodation, food, transportation, personal expenses, textbooks etc.
Administrative fees	<p>Estimated compulsory payments:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SGD 250 per semester for Exchange UG students <p>Compulsory miscellaneous fees include administrative costs; IT facilities; sports; amenities; student health service; insurance, etc.</p> <p>Students should ensure they have sufficient monies to pay for these compulsory payments upon arrival / registration at NIE.</p>
Student's Pass fees	<p>Student's Pass <i>[payable to Immigration & Checkpoints Authority]</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Processing fee: *SGD 30, payable upon application • Issuance fee: *SGD 60, payable upon approval of Student Pass • Multiple Journey Visa (if applicable): *SGD 30 • COVID-19 certification verification record to ingest into Singapore National Immunisation Registry (NIR). This service costs \$26.75 and in event serology test is required, it will cost \$53.50. It takes about 1 to 2 working days for the data to reflect in NIR. <p><i>* Fees are subject to ICA's changes</i></p>

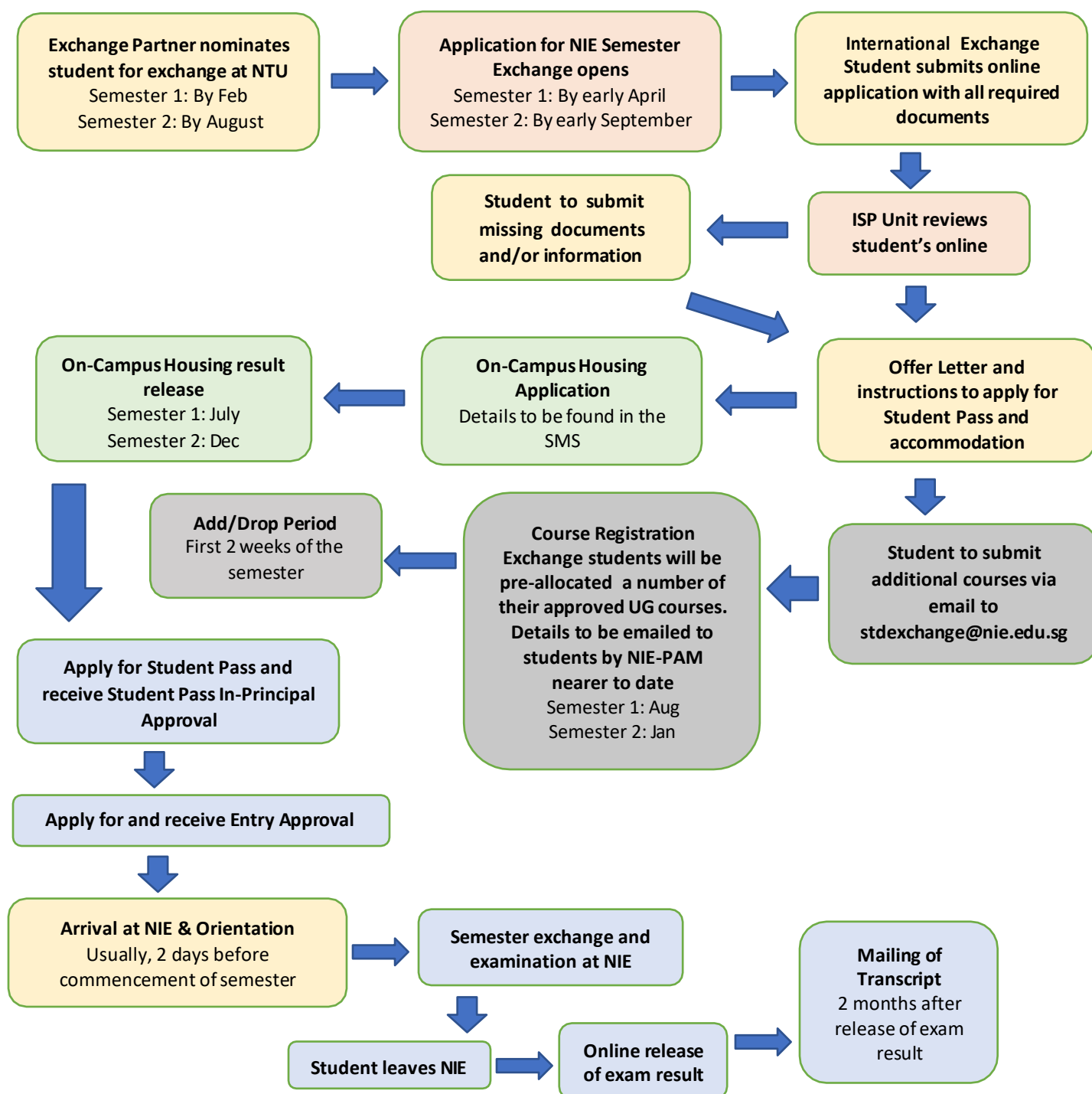

On-campus banking facilities	<p>There are banking facilities available on-campus operated by Oversea-Chinese Banking Corporation (OCBC) Singapore – NTU Campus branch. Please note that an administrative fee may apply if you close the bank account within the first six months.</p> <p>Students may also visit Jurong Point Shopping Centre website at this link, which is located near our campus, for their banking needs.</p>
Acceptable credit/bank cards	<p>Visa / Mastercard / American Express / Diners Club / Maestro / PLUS. You may withdraw monies from the automated teller machines (ATM) located around the campus.</p>

Pre-departure and Arrival

Arrival Date	<p>Exchange students are strongly recommended to arrive and complete all quarantine/self- isolation requirements at least three days before the commencement of Teaching Week to attend the half-day orientation briefing. The orientation briefing is usually held on a Thursday or Friday of the week prior to the term commencement date. The details of the orientation briefing can be found in the Welcome email.</p> <p>Students who are successful in their application for on-campus housing shall be informed of their check-in date by Office of Campus Housing before their arrival.</p>
Vaccinations	<p>Students coming from or who have passed through any country at risk of yellow fever six days prior to arriving in Singapore, are required to have valid certificates of vaccination for yellow fever. Please refer to Immigration & Checkpoints Authority's website for more information.</p>
Airport Reception	<p>There is no airport reception.</p> <p>Students would need to complete all quarantine/self-isolation requirements at off campus accommodation before making their way to the NIE NTU campus.</p> <p>For more information on how to get started at NIE NTU, refer to this link.</p>
