DOCUMENTS TO PREPARE

English Proficiency

Proof of English language proficiency is not required for students who are native speakers of English, or where English is the core language of instruction in the home institution.

Below are the guidelines for the level of English proficiency best suited to studying at NIE:

- General Paper of the Singapore Cambridge GCE 'A' Level Examination (sat in 2007 onwards): A, B, C, D, E
- General Paper of the Singapore Cambridge GCE 'A' Level Examination (sat in 2006 or earlier): A1, A2, B3, B4, C5, C6
- IELTS: a minimum of 6 for the Writing sub-test
- TOEFL: a minimum of 570 (paper) or 90 (internet) or 237 (computer)
- SAT1: a minimum of 600 for the Verbal section; or 7 for the Essay section
- IB: a minimum of 4 for Higher Level English or 4 for Standard Level English
- MUET: Band 6 and a minimum of 50 for writing
- GEPT: High intermediate Stage 2 consisting of writing and speaking modules (applies to students from Taiwan universities only)

The guidelines are in place to ensure NENU students are suited to cope with the rigorous curriculum conducted in English.

If you do not have any of the tests mentioned above, you may request for a letter from your home university, confirming your English proficiency and ability to follow classes in English.

Courses Selection

During application, NENU students are required to select **at least ten courses per semester** (in order of preference) for approval. Course approval is subjected to vacancies and pre- requisites.

- This is to ensure that you have an adequate number of approved courses prior to arrival in NIE.
- Please ensure that the courses you select are suitable for credit transfer back at your home university.
- Selected courses are subject to approval by the offering Schools in NIE. However, approval does not mean a guaranteed enrolment in the courses, as courses are subjected to vacancies and class/exam timetable.
- Once approved, you are strongly encouraged not to deviate from the list of approved courses. It is imperative that you select courses which are approved by your home university, and are deemed necessary for your academic progression.
- Requests to reselect courses while you are in NIE will only be processed if there are valid reasons.

Course Issues:

In the event you do not have sufficient approved courses **prior** to your arrival at NIE, you may still add on or modify your course plan during the 2-week add/drop period **after** your arrival at NIE. Please note that course approval are subjected to NIE pre-requisites and vacancies. Hence, you must be prepared to read other courses if you do not meet the pre-requisites.

Study Programmes	<p>NENU students on Study programmes are advised to take courses of the same level as their degree.</p> <p>Courses are subject to approval from the NIE School(s). Selection of courses does not automatically guarantee approval and availability of courses for NENU students.</p> <p>NENU students are only able to read UG courses, and are strictly prohibited from applying for Postgraduate (PG) courses.</p>

Course Registration	<p>NENU students will be pre-allocated a number of their approved UG courses during NIE course registration. You may still register for additional approved UG courses during the Add/Drop period in the first two weeks of the semester.</p> <p>Please note that while NIE will try to meet the demand where possible, NENU students should expect that not all demands can be met, and NENU students are encouraged to be flexible with their study plan.</p>

Housing

<p>On-campus housing for inbound students</p>	<p>Incoming Study NENU students may apply for on-campus housing on availability basis.</p> <p>Upon acceptance as an NENU student, you may apply online for on campus housing through the application form provided in the Welcome email before the stipulated closing date.</p> <p>NENU students who have submitted an online application for campus housing before the stipulated closing date will be considered for on-campus housing, on availability basis. NENU students who are unsuccessful in their campus housing application would need to look for off-campus options.</p> <p>NENU students who are successful in their campus housing application will be allocated randomly for hall rooms, and requests for specific types of rooms will be evaluated on a case by case basis. NENU students with medical condition(s) and/or have specific requests will have to submit a doctor's letter certifying their condition, which shall subsequently be verified by NTU's Medical Centre.</p> <p>NENU students are required to declare medical conditions and requests when submitting their application to the ISP unit. Request for specific room-mates or preferred Halls is not allowed.</p> <p>Full-year NENU students, who successfully secured on-campus housing for their first semester must re-apply for housing in their second semester. Period of stay in the Hall is determined by the approved period as stipulated on the NIE Offer Letter.</p> <p>Please see housing options for more information.</p>
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Housing

Check-in date for Halls of Residence	<p>The earliest that NENU students may move into their allocated room in the Hall of Residence is usually three days before the commencement of the Teaching Week.</p> <p>The Office of Campus Housing (OCH) shall notify the NENU students on the exact check-in date and timings via EMAIL. Check-in will only be available during weekdays and office hours of the hall admin offices.</p> <p>NENU students who intend to arrive earlier than the check-in date and/or arrive outside of office hours will have to source for temporary off-campus housing. Off-Campus Housing	<p>NENU students seeking off-campus housing should begin their search well in advance of their arrival in Singapore. NENU students are recommended to search in Estates near NIE NTU such as: Boon Lay, Jurong West and Jurong East.</p> <p>For more information please refer to this link.</p>

Immigration and Entry Requirements

Student Pass	<p>All international students who have been accepted and offered a place as a full-time matriculated or registered student are required to hold a valid Student Pass issued by the Singapore Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA).</p> <p>You will be notified of the Student Pass application procedures via email. NENU students are advised to arrange their flights only after their Student Pass and Entry Approval applications have been approved.</p> <p>All international students holding Student Pass are not allowed to work during the immersion period.</p>
Entry Visa Requirements	<p>Students who require an entry visa to enter Singapore <u>need not</u> apply for one.</p> <p>Upon approval of the Student Pass application, an In-Principle Approval (IPA) letter will be issued to the NENU students. A single journey visa shall be incorporated in the IPA letter for entry into Singapore.</p> <p>For more immigration matters, you may refer to this link.</p>

Immigration and Entry Requirements

<p>Entry Approval (Student's Pass Holder Lane)</p>	<p>Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, additional entry requirements are implemented by the Singapore government.</p> <p>All Student Pass holders must apply for and obtain Entry Approval before traveling to Singapore. The Entry Approval is an approval to allow the pass holder to enter Singapore and is a separate process from the Student Pass application. Application for Entry Approval (via Student Pass Holder Lane - STPHL) must be done at least 2 weeks before the planned date of entry. NENU students should only proceed to travel to Singapore <u>after</u> Entry Approval has been granted.</p> <p>Depending on your vaccination status and travel history, you may be required to serve a quarantine or Stay-Home Notice (SHN), if applicable, based on prevailing SHN and entry requirements at the time of your entry to Singapore. You may also need to take COVID-19 swab tests upon arrival and before you complete your SHN.</p> <p><u>Instructions for submitting Entry Approval application (under STPHL)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) NENU students should have received their Student Pass In-Principle Approval first before commencing their Entry Approval application. (ii) Before application for Entry Approval, NENU students should ensure they have read through the following items: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Entry Approval application requirements and process for Student Pass holders. <i>Link: Overview of Entry Approval Requirements and Process</i> b. Application user guide. <i>Link: Guide to Applying for Entry Approval</i> (iii) NENU students may submit their Entry Approval application at least 2 weeks before planned date of entry via the Safe Travel Office portal here: https://eservices.ica.gov.sg/STO <p>NENU students will only be able to select from the period of entry dates seen on the portal; and ensure they are able to travel on the selected period of entry, as changes in the period of entry will not be allowed after approval is issued. Payments (if required) are non-refundable.</p>
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Travel Health Control Measures for Entry

There are different requirements based on travellers' **travel history before arrival in Singapore**.

As border measures can change at short notice, students must refer to Safe Travel website for latest border measures and **countries/regions categories applicable for Student Pass Holder Lane (STPHL)**: <https://safetravel.ica.gov.sg/stpl/overview>

Depending on their travel history and vaccination status, students may qualify to apply for entry to Singapore under the Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL). Students may refer to Safe Travel website for **requirements and process for the Vaccinated Travel Lane**: <https://safetravel.ica.gov.sg/vtl/requirements-and-process>. Students will only need to apply for entry **either** through the STPHL or VTL.

COVID-19 Vaccination	All Student Pass holders must be fully vaccinated in order to enter Singapore. Refer to https://safetravel.ica.gov.sg/health/vtsg for information on accepted COVID-19 vaccinations.
Pre-departure Test	<p>Inbound travellers with travel history to specified countries/regions will be required to present a valid negative COVID-19 test result taken before departure to Singapore.</p> <p>NENU students will be required to show documentary proof of a negative COVID-19 test result from recognised laboratories/medical facilities. The test result document must be in English (or accompanied with an English translation); and contain the following information: COVID-19 test result and date of test; Traveller's name; and date of birth or passport number.</p> <p>The documentary proof of pre-departure test must be produced at immigration, failing which NENU students will be refused entry. Travel Health Control Measures for Entry

On-arrival Swab Test	Travellers entering Singapore may be required to take an on-arrival PCR swab test upon arrival in Singapore.
Stay-Home Notice (SHN)	<p>The Stay-Home Notice (SHN) is a legal notice that requires travellers to remain in their place of residence or SHN Dedicated Facility (SDF) for a stipulated period. The failure to comply with any SHN requirement is punishable under Singapore laws and can amount to an imprisonment term and/or fine.</p> <p>As such, NENU students who are required to serve SHN must ensure that they comply with the SHN requirements and remain in their allocated SHN dedicated facility (SDF) or SHN accommodation for the duration of the SHN.</p> <p><u>SHN Monitoring</u></p> <p>All NENU students serving SHN will be contacted by NIE during the SHN. All NENU students should remain contactable via WhatsApp, Teams, or their NTU email account and may be contacted by ISP team.</p>
Swab Test during SHN	NENU students serving SHN would be required to take a PCR swab test before the end of the SHN. NENU students will be informed of their swab test venue, timing, and instructions.

Health and Wellness	<p>Medical, dental and counselling services are available on campus to cater to your health and wellness needs.</p> <p>Should you feel unwell after office hours, you may proceed to nearby Clinics for assistance. For acute medical care and emergencies, please visit the nearest hospital, Ng Teng Fong General Hospital.</p> <p>For more information on Health and Wellness, you may refer to NIE Wellness Centre. Medical Declaration	<p>To ensure that your well-being is addressed, NENU students who have existing conditions (medical, physical/mobility, sensory impairment, neurological deficits and/or learning disabilities) are required to submit medical documentation and/or specialist assessment reports during online application stage for verification.</p> <p>NENU students will be requested to provide the following documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Letter or memo from doctor certifying the NENU student is fit for overseas immersion programme. The letter must be in English, and should be issued by the attending psychiatrist or medical practitioner specialising on the declared condition; • Doctor's memo indicating medication and dosages. The memo needs to be in English, and indicates current prescription including alternative medication; • Assessment report (if required); • Accommodation letter (in English) from home university, describing type of support provided at home university. <p>Upon arrival at NIE, NENU students are required to undergo further medical assessments/counselling to ascertain appropriate support services if so needed, for the well-being of students. These assessments may be conducted internally at NTU or externally by third-party service providers. In such cases, NENU students need to bear the costs for such assessments.</p> <p>For NENU students on long-term medication, please refer to Health Sciences Authority's website for more information on bringing personal medication into Singapore.</p>

Well-Being and Insurance

Declaration of Disability	<p>NENU students who have a disability and require academic support services must submit documentary proof of their disability (doctor's letter and assessment report in English) and an accommodation letter in English from their home university, indicating the type of support services they are currently receiving. Please note that NIE support services may be different from what is offered in the home university. NENU students should also bring along the original assessment report during the semester.</p> <p>The information is important for review and advice on availability of similar support services at NIE.</p>
Health Screening	<p>Inbound students who are studying at NIE/NTU for more than 6 months will need to undergo a health screening at the NTU's Medical Centre - Fullerton Health @ NTU. The health screening results may be used to fulfil the Immigration & Checkpoints Authority's (ICA) requirements for Student Pass Holders, unless otherwise advised.</p> <p>Details of the health screening and appointment time slots will be advised during student's arrival. Please note that the health screening will incur an estimated cost of \$50 to \$100.</p>

Well-Being and Insurance

NIE NTU Student Insurance Schemes

It is compulsory for all NENU students to be covered under the NIE NTU student insurance schemes, namely Group Personal Accident Insurance (GPAI), Group Hospitalisation & Surgical Insurance (GHSI) and Medical scheme, even if NENU students have already bought similar insurance in their home country. **The cost of these student insurance schemes is included in the compulsory NIE NTU Miscellaneous fees.**

Falling ill and being hospitalised in Singapore can be a financial drain on international students, who are not entitled to the medical subsidies that Singapore citizens enjoy. Besides the coverage it provides, the GHSI (subject to its terms and conditions) allows you to request a Letter of Guarantee from the underwriter and present it in lieu of the requisite deposit upon admission to government/restructured hospitals in Singapore.

Well-Being and Insurance

Personal Insurance

NENU students would be covered by the NTU Student Insurance Schemes mentioned above. It is recommended for you to familiarise yourself with the insurance coverage provided by these Student Insurance Schemes. [Link](#)

With the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, it is recommended that you ensure you have sufficient and comprehensive coverage for COVID-19 treatment and travel during your trip (to and from Singapore), as well as during the semester. You may wish to purchase additional personal or travel insurance for further coverage.

Depending on prevailing border measures at the point of arrival, you may also be required to provide proof of travel insurance or medical insurance coverage for entry to Singapore.

Costs

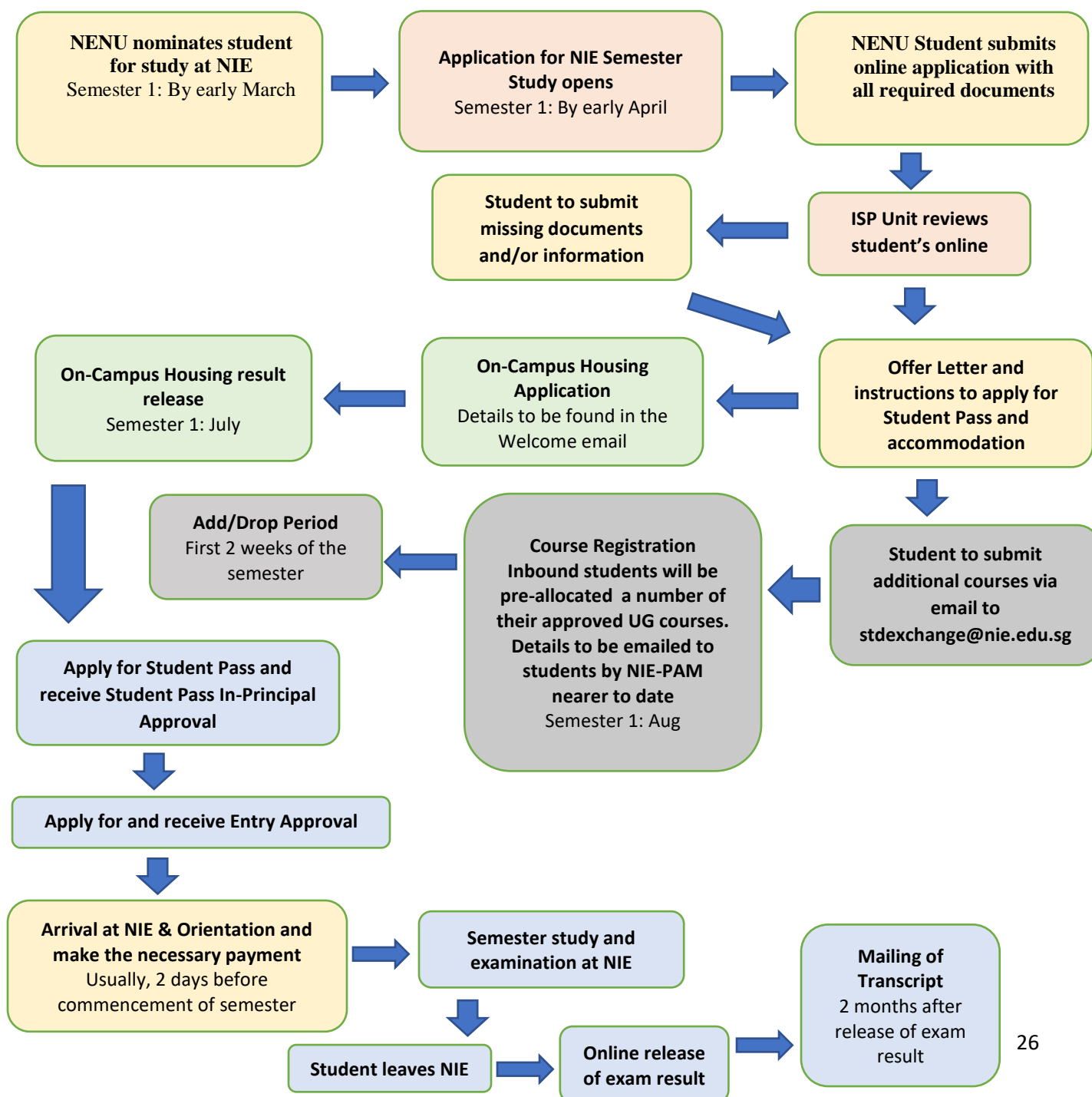

Pre-departure and Arrival

The orientation briefing is usually held on a Thursday or Friday of the week prior to the term commencement date. The details of the orientation briefing can be found in the Welcome email.</p> <p>NENU students who are successful in their application for on-campus housing shall be informed of their check-in date by Office of Campus Housing before their arrival.</p>
Vaccinations	<p>NENU students coming from or who have passed through any country at risk of yellow fever six days prior to arriving in Singapore, are required to have valid certificates of vaccination for yellow fever. Please refer to Immigration & Checkpoints Authority's website for more information.</p>
COVID-19 Vaccination	<p>Depending on vaccination status and travel history, NENU students may apply to enter Singapore through different SafeTravel lanes, and different quarantine requirements may also apply. Please refer to the SafeTravel website to find out the applicable SafeTravel lanes and requirements for entry.</p>
Airport Reception	<p>There is no airport reception.</p> <p>NENU students would need to complete all quarantine/self-isolation requirements at offcampus accommodation before making their way to the NIE NTU campus.</p> <p>For more information on how to get started at NIE NTU, refer to this link.</p>
